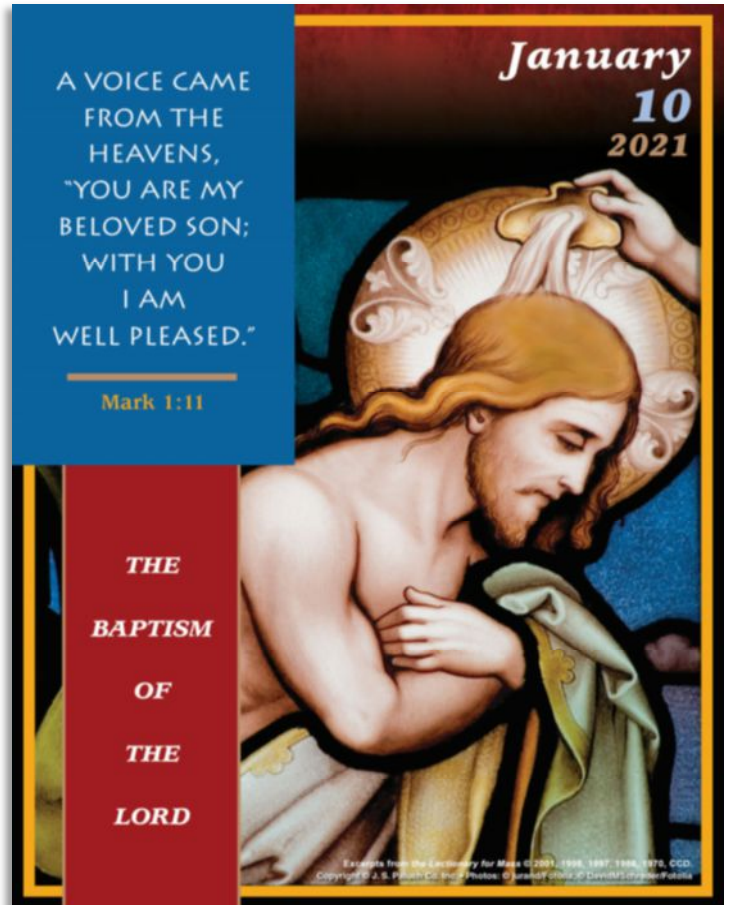

## Feast of the Baptism of the Lord

January 10, 2021

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7; Acts 10:34-38; Mark 1:7-11

Psalm 29

Today we celebrate the feast of Jesus' Baptism. At the age of 30, Jesus presented himself to the people who were awaiting the arrival of the Messiah. He wanted to begin the same as those whom John the Baptist preached to and who received the baptism of conversion for their repentance. Jesus wanted to join the people and be baptized.

Upon hearing about Jesus' baptism, and by reflecting upon our own, we can see that the sacrament of Baptism is much more than a family celebration of parents, godparents and friends. **Baptism is the celebration of new life in our families and in the Church.**

Something powerful occurred the day Jesus stood in line waiting to be baptized by John the Baptist. John baptized the people as a sign of repentance; of their wish to change their lives so that they could be ready for the arrival of the Messiah. Jesus did not have a need to repent for **he was without sin**. Nevertheless, he joined the people.

Upon being baptized by John the Baptist, a voice is heard from heaven saying **"This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."** With this, **Jesus began preaching; he was ready to show his Father to the world.** He was not going to say that God was only his Father. On the contrary, he taught us to call God: Our Father.

Today's second reading tells us that Jesus was anointed with the Holy Spirit with the power that enabled him to cure the sick and free the captive. **The power of Jesus can change the world.** His message is "the Good News of peace." Peace with God, peace among all human beings.

In our baptism, God told each one of us: "You are my beloved son (daughter), with you I am pleased." When we think of people that have been chosen by God to do great things, we tend to think of others such as St. Francis, Mother Theresa, or even the Pope. None of these great people had anything you and I don't have. We have been given the greatest power: the power of the Holy Spirit.

We have been anointed with the same Holy Spirit as Jesus. We have received the same power. We have been called to carry justice to a world of injustice, to carry compassion to an indifferent world, to carry peace to a world of violence. **By baptism, we are united to Christ, anointed priest, prophet and king.**

Jesus joined a group of sinners to be baptized by John the Baptist. Now he offers us, as sinners, the opportunity to join **Him**. Jesus shares with us the glory of being sons and daughters, and His Spirit fills us with the power to carry peace and justice to our world.

May God bless you.

## Fiesta del Bautismo del Señor

10 de enero del 2021

Isaías 42:1-4, 6-7; Hechos 10:34-38; Marcos 1:7-11

Salmo 29

Hoy celebramos la fiesta del Bautismo de Jesús. A los 30 años se presentó ante el pueblo que esperaba la llegada del Mesías y quiso comenzar como todos aquellos a los que Juan Bautista predicaba y que arrepentidos recibían el bautismo de conversión. Jesús quiso mezclarse con el pueblo y bautizarse.

Al escuchar el relato del Bautismo de Jesús, y reflexionar sobre nuestro bautismo, vemos que el Bautismo es mucho más que una fiesta familiar de compadres, amigos, etc. **El Bautismo es celebración de nueva vida en nuestras familias y en la Iglesia.**

Algo muy potente ocurrió el día en que Jesús se puso en la fila de los que esperaban ser bautizados por Juan Bautista. Juan bautizaba a la gente como signo de arrepentimiento, de deseo de cambiar sus vidas para estar preparados para la llegada del Mesías. Jesús no tenía necesidad de arrepentirse; **él no tenía pecado**. Y sin embargo se unió a la gente.

Al ser bautizado por Juan Bautista, se oyó una voz del cielo que decía: **"Este es mi hijo muy amado, en quien tengo mis complacencias"**. Con eso comenzó la predicación de Jesús. **Jesús se dispuso a mostrarle a su Padre al mundo.** No iba a decir que Dios era sólo Padre suyo; más bien nos enseñó a llamar a Dios: Padre nuestro.

La segunda lectura de hoy nos dice que Jesús fue ungido con el Espíritu Santo que lo capacitó para curar a los enfermos, liberar a los cautivos. **El poder de Jesús puede cambiar el mundo.** Su mensaje es "la buena noticia de la PAZ". PAZ con Dios, paz entre todos los seres humanos.

En nuestro bautismo Dios nos dijo a cada uno de nosotros: "Tú eres mi hijo amado; en tí tengo mis complacencias". Cuando pensamos en personas que han sido elegidas por Dios para hacer grandes cosas, siempre pensamos en otros. Pensamos en San Francisco, en la Madre Teresa, o incluso en el Papa. Ninguna de esas grandes personas tuvo algo que no tengamos tú y yo. Se nos ha dado el más grande poder: el poder del Espíritu Santo.

Hemos sido ungidos con el mismo Espíritu que Jesús. Hemos recibido el mismo poder. Hemos sido llamados a llevar la justicia a un mundo de injusticia, a llevar la compasión a un mundo despiadado, a llevar la paz a un mundo de violencia. **Por el bautismo, nos unimos a Cristo, ungido sacerdote, profeta y rey.**

Jesús se unió a un grupo de pecadores para ser bautizado por Juan. Ahora Jesús nos ofrece a nosotros, pecadores, la oportunidad de unirnos a **Él**. Jesús comparte con nosotros la gloria de ser hijos, y su Espíritu nos llena con el poder de llevar la justicia y la paz a nuestro mundo.

## THE WATERS OF BAPTISM

When new sod is put in, it needs constant saturation with water. Landscapers say that this “knits” the sod to the soil. The same when a branch is grafted onto a tree: the poultice that joins them at the splice must be kept wet at all times. Water is the stuff that binds the very cells of our bodies together. No wonder religions throughout all times and cultures have used it so prominently. When Jesus stepped into the Jordan for baptism, he “knit” himself to what had come before him. By going to the Jordan, he made himself one with the people of Israel who had crossed it into their Promised Land. With John the Baptist, Christ wove himself into the prophetic tradition that heralded the coming reign of God. He had become fully human in the waters of Mary’s womb, and by partaking in the rite of the baptism of repentance, Jesus identified himself with our sinful, frail humanity. It is through the waters of baptism that Christ continues to graft new members onto his Body, the Church; through these waters we are cleansed from sin and filled with the promise of grace, given our destiny for eternal life. For us, as for Jesus, it is also the waters of baptism that inaugurate our mission to proclaim the Good News.



## LAS AGUAS BAUTISMALES

Cuando se planta un césped nuevo, debe regarse constantemente. Los jardineros dicen que esto “teje” el césped al suelo. Lo mismo sucede cuando se injerta una rama a un árbol: el cataplasma que los une debe estar húmedo en todo momento.

El agua es lo que mantiene unidas a las células de nuestro cuerpo. Con razón las religiones de todas las épocas y culturas han usado tanto este símbolo. Cuando Jesús se sumerge en el Jordán para ser bautizado, se “teje” a todo aquello que lo precedía. Al sumergirse en el Jordán, se hizo uno con el pueblo de

Israel que había cruzado el río para llegar a su Tierra Prometida. Junto a Juan Bautista, Cristo se tejió a la tradición profética que presagiaba la venida del Reino de Dios. Jesús se había convertido plenamente en humano en las aguas del vientre de María y al participar del rito del Bautismo del arrepentimiento, se sintió identificado con nuestra frágil y pecaminosa humanidad. Por las aguas del Bautismo Cristo continúa injertando nuevos miembros a su Cuerpo, la Iglesia; gracias a nuestro destino de vida eterna, por estas aguas somos limpiados del pecado y recibimos la promesa de la gracia. Para nosotros, como para Jesús, las aguas bautismales también inauguran nuestra misión de proclamar la Buena Nueva.




## St. Jude Food Pantry
